



Northern Peru 12 - 26 mar 2005



Abra Patricia offers some of the best birding in South America!

General

This trip was organized by Kolibri Expeditions. Although during the rainy season we had mainly fair weather with some rain and fog mainly during the second week that disturbed birding, especially at Afluentes in the lower Abra Patricia area. The birdactivity was generally good. At some places we had local guides to help us, more for encourage them and have them earn some money then that we really needed them although a few extra pairs of eyes are useful.

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Itinerary

12 mar - Roger and Adriano met the participants at Cajamarca airport in the morning and we went straight to nearby Rio Chonta. After some search and picking up most of the common birds, we found a male Gray-bellied comet which was the main target here. Other good birds that made their way onto the list was Black metaltail and Baron's spinetail. While we birded Adriano set the table with breakfast. When we were finished here we started to drive towards Celendin but as we reached higher altitude the weather got progressively worse and we had rain for most of the afternoon.

13 mar - Up early and off to el Limon in the Marañon drainage. At dawn we had a fantastic view over el Limon and we could also see the Marañon river 2000 metres lower down. As we approached the birding area Roger saw a Thornbird-nest and we stopped and the Chestnut-backed thornbird, one of the targets, was singing and we all had good views. Just a few minutes later we found the next target - the Gray-winged inca-finch and we could start birding more relaxed. Again Adriano was preparing breakfast as we birded. We continued birding and saw some female Purple-collared woodstars when Ron said -There's a male over here. We turned to look and indeed it was a male - but not a Purple-collared. It was a male Little woodstar!!! It obviously had it's favorite perch on top of a dry stick and we could enjoy this tiny figure for the next half hour. For some of us this was among one of the candidates for bird-of-the-trip. On the way back from Celendin to Cajamarca we checked the Shrike-tyrants and this paid off as one turned out to be the rare White-tailed. As we watched it we also found a Striated earthcreeper. Next stop was for 'Cajamarca' Rufous antpitta. After some playbacks one eventually responded but we never saw it.

14 mar - Another pre-dawn start and this time we headed out of Cajamarca to San Marcos. We headed up the valley looking at the numerous hummingbirds and trying in vain for the Great spinetail. We did have good views of Buff-bridled inca-finches as well as other more common birds. After breakfast most of the day was spent in the van driving down to the coast. The last hours were spent at Rafan south of Chiclayo. It seemed dead when we came but after a while Roger found a Peruvian Plantcutter and soon we also found a Rufous Flycatcher, the two target species here, alongside a few other Tumbesian species.

15 mar - Up early and drive to Chaparri inland from Chiclayo. After picking up a local guide we entered the park and soon several flocks of Sulphur-throated finches flew by. It was hard to get a good look at them but eventually we had that as well. After breakfast we walked around with local guides and picked up the target - Tumbes tyrant, another candidate for bird-of-the-trip (excluding hummingbirds). During the hottest hours we drove back to Chiclayo and up to Bosque Pomac where we saw several other Tumbesian birds. On the way out the security system in the car broke down and there was no way to start the car. A Bicolored hawk flew over while we waited for Adriano to find the problem. An hour later



the car started suddenly and we could continue to Olmos.

16 mar - 4 am departure to what was supposed to be a nice day but turned out to be something else. Due to the last weeks rain the poor road was in even worse conditions and at one place half of the road was gone and while Adriano avoided that part the car sank down to the bottom in mud and we were thoroughly stuck. After digging for two hours we gave up and ate breakfast and started birding towards el Limon. At the village we found some people that went ahead to the car to help us out. When we came back they were just finished and the car was on level ground again. This meant that we missed the morning and therefore also the wild White-winged guans! We drove back to the main road and twitched staked-out Striped owls. We saw four of those before heading for lunch and another try for Limon but on another road. We got there and picked up local guide Lino and walked up the quebrada. Black-and-white tanagers were singing everywhere and we saw some White-faced brush-finches but failed to find the guans.

17 mar - Leaving Olmos pre-dawn and drive to Limon de Porcuya where we walked the track which only has rather degraded habitat. We had good views of Black-cowled saltators (sorry Marcia) and Roger randomly played Chapman's antshrike and suddenly a male sat in front of us. It was however Pieter who scored the bird-of-the-day when he found a Piura chat-tyrant. It proved elusive for a while but eventually we all had excellent views of this rare peruvian endemic. When it was getting hotter we went back to the road and drove to Jaen. Marcia felt all but good and stayed behind while the rest of us walked the track uphill. Maranon slaty-antshrike was elusive and high up Roger taped out a Maranon crescentchest. On the way down we tried again for the antshrike and had brief views. Chinchipe spinetail is rather common here but we had failed to find one but suddenly one sang close by and Roger got a recording and it came in very nicely to the playback and thus all the targets for this site was bagged. An hour drive took us to Bagua Chica for the night.

18 mar - Just outside Bagua was the first stop for the day. Soon we saw our target the Little inca-finch and could have a relaxed breakfast. The rest of the day was driving to Pomacochas with some rather uninspired stops. It was very hot and humid today. At Pomacochas we walked the road for a while and found a female Marvelous spatuletail. I have never seen people so disappointed when seeing a good peruvian endemic, but you do want to see an adult male of this species. Soon our local guide showed up and informed us that he had a male coming to some flowers on his land. No problems persuading the group to do the 15 minutes walk. After a little while the male showed up but in traditional hummingbird-manner it disappeared just as quickly. After a while it came back and gave fantastic views to everyone. The mood was up and bird-of-the-trip was thoroughly bagged.

19 mar - As Sword-billed hummingbird was high on everyones list and as the male Spatuletail was seen yesterday and the rio Chido trail had been converted to a driveable road, we hired a taxi to take us up to San Lorenzo at 2700 m. We started to walk uphill in hope of getting to the forest but Pieter was too sick to join so he stayed behind. The rest of us headed uphill but all we found was just patches of forest and not many birds seen. Some new hummingbirds and a heard Pale-billed antpittawas all until we heard a Blackish tapaculo singing nearby. Recording made and we sneaked into the bamboo and played it. We all had good views and Ron-the-optimist started fiddling with his camera and to my surprise he got very good pictures of the tapaculo! On the way down we heard another Pale-billed antpitta close and recorded it. We played the tape for a while but it never came into view unfortunately. all in all a rather disappointing day considering the possibilities up here and the degraded habitat.

20 mar - Today we drove to the pass at Abra Patricia and soon started to pick up good birds like Emerald-bellied puffleg before breakfast. A flock of noisy White-capped tanagers joined us for breakfast. We walked down the road and suddenly Pieter cried out –Sword-billed hummingbird! When the excitement started to cool down we could concentrate on Lulu's tody-flycatchers and other birds. During the rest of the day we worked our way back and forth along the road picking up Bar-winged wood-wren etc. Night in Pomacochas.

21 mar - We started at the higher parts at a stake-out we have for Royal sunangel and soon saw three males there. We also tried the LSU trail a short bit and had good views of the stunning Vermilion tana-



gers. During the afternoon we birded our way down to Aguas Verdes att 1000 m where we camped in the restaurant. In the evening Band-bellied owl and Lyre-tailed nightjar were singing from the hill.

22 mar - This should have been a good day in Afluentes area but instead it was rain from 5 am to 3 pm! We took shelter in a small restaurant at the top and had some view. An Ecuadorian piedtail made a short apperance and in the afternoon we hit a flock and picked up more birds. In the evening we went up to the pass again and had nice views of Swallow-tailed nightjar. As there had been an assault along the road three weeks earlier, we arrange to have a police patrol joining us for this quest. In the evening we packed up and drove to Nuevo Cajamarca for the night.

23 mar - Up early and back to Afluentes. Lined antshrike and White-backed fire-eye sang in the morning and a White-crowned tapaculo did the same and was tape-recorded by Roger. After breakfast we managed to tape it in so everyone had good views. When we came out of the brush an Umbrellabird made a short apperance. Then came the rain. It stayed until after lunch when it cleared up and we tried the muddy trail opposite the restaurant and hit a flock in the forest, but the hoped-fore sicklebill, which Roger saw here in 2003, failed to show. Night was spent in Rioja.

24 mar - Today it was a bit of a lay-in as our birding site, Yacumama, was near Rioja. Surprisingly quiet in the morning, you should have been here last month. We walked into the park area which has nice trails and a restaurant. Nice but a bit slow birding produced a flock of three Point-tailed palmcreepers and Green kingfisher among others. Oriole blackbird and Troupial in the same scope-view is not too bad. After a siesta during the hottest hours we went out on a road close to Rioja. Ron had to turn back as he forgot his bins!!! Pieter and Marcia meanwhile saw a Russet-crowned crane. We heard several more later and also saw two more but not much else of interest.

25 mar - The security system of the car decided to strike today which delayed us an hour. When that was taken care of we drove on to Morro de Calzada only to find out that the last days rain had made the road undriveable so we had to walk the last kilometre. Once at the foot of the mountain we had only just started to bird when the rain came. We took shelter for a while before giving up. We drove on to Tarapoto where the whether was better and birded along the rive Huallaga near Juan Guerra in the afternoon. Rather nice birding for being in the afternoon.

26 mar - Last day and up along the Yurimaguas road. This site offers good road-side birding in nice forest in the foothills which is rare nowadays. Several nice birds were seen here like Koepke's hermit, Red-crowned parakeet, White hawk and Fiery-capped manakin. The Mono y Gato (Monkey and Cat) restaurant offers good food and a nice view of the forest. When it was getting hotter and more quiet we called it a day and went down to Tarapoto for refreshing and reorganizing of the luggage before flying back to Lima. Roger stayed behind and went to a new biological station along the Yurimaguas road for another week. See report on www.kolibriexpeditions.com






